



Fall 2011 Internship

The W.E.B. Du Bois Society announces its 2011-2012 internship opportunities for African-American undergraduate and graduate students interested in working in a non-profit in the education space. Interns work in our program department or on special projects in the president's office. Working in our program department requires an interest in education and the development of young people. Most projects require effective problem solving, communication, and basic research skills, initiative, and dependability. Qualified applicants are encouraged to apply.

The Internships in our program department and in the office of the president are awarded to college sophomores, juniors and seniors. Students selected to intern must have a cumulative average of 3.2 GPA or better, the potential to lead and take initiative, possess effective problem solving and communication skills, and an interest in working with youth. Interns in our program department mentor and advise high school students and assist the program director. Interns in the office of the president, work on research and special projects. Applicants should have a work history and a background working as part of a team. Applicants must have completed their freshman year to be eligible for this internship. Rising college freshmen are not eligible. After an initial review of the applications a small number of students will be invited for an interview..

Official transcript(s)

Official transcripts are required of all semifinalist applicants and must be sent directly by the registrar of the applicant's college or university. Graduate students must supply both official undergraduate and graduate transcripts. Transcripts must be postmarked by April 19, 2011, and mailed to:
